#### → MONTHLY SYNOPSIS ←

February 2023 – February is a month of contrasts. We barely finish the Christmas season when we are thrown into the penitential season of Lent. It is a good time to remember our great spiritual mentors such as Michael the Archangel and the necessity of living a moral life in a time of social chaos.



## THE PRAYER TO ST. MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL

Of all the angels known to Scripture, none has a place of eminence like St. Michael the Archangel. He is the only angel to appear in at least four books of the Bible (Joshua 5-6, Daniel 12, Jude 9, Revelation 12). Clearly, St. Michael is the most important of all angels and is rightly known as the "Prince of the Heavenly Host" and the "Protector of the Church."

Most people don't know that Michael's name is not actually a name – it is a battle cry! In response to Lucifer's audacity in comparing himself to the Creator, Michael immediately rose and rebuked the wicked angel with the phrase that became his name: "Who is like God?" In the Hebrew language this rhetorical question consists of three short syllables: "Mi-cha-El" Michael. He then cast Satan and the other rebellious angels from Heaven in the ferocious battle that we read about in Chapter 12 of the Book of Revelation.

Despite the Church's long devotion to the warrior angel, its most famous prayer to the Archangel Michael is

rather recent, and there is a fascinating story about its origins. The records are not clear on the exact date, but sometime between 1884 and 1886, when Pope Leo XIII had just finished celebrating Mass, he had a mystical vision in which he saw demons gathering in Rome and heard the devil talking to Jesus.

According to the report, the devil was boasting that he could destroy the Church and demanded sufficient time to do so. Supposedly, our Lord allowed the devil the space of a century in which to attempt to accomplish his evil agenda. This dialogue shook the Pope to his core, and he became extremely pale and afraid of what he had just heard. When Pope Leo came out of his mystical vision, he immediately went to his desk and wrote down what we now know as the Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel. The Church greatly encourages the faithful to pray it as a protection from spiritual evil in our world.

#### THE PRAYER TO ST. MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL

Saint Michael Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil; may God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into Hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

#### SPIRITUAL CHALLENGE

This month's challenge is to call upon the great Archangel Michael and ask him for the grace to live your Catholic faith more vitally and to protect your children and loved ones from all spiritual harm. St. Michael is the Protector of the Church, so also ask his intercession for the Church Militant as it experiences many persecutions and upheavals.

#### - FAITH FUNDAMENTALS -

#### The Ten Commandments

The Catechism calls the Ten Commandments "fundamental duties" (CCC, 2072) toward God and man. This is where God makes some basic demands on all His children, but His demands are hardly burdensome. In eight out of ten cases, the commandments simply tell us what to avoid for our own good and the good of our neighbor! These "negative" commandments are the bare minimum of what it means to live a moral life.

Here is a refresher course on God's Law:

- 1 "I am the Lord thy God, thou shalt not have any strange gods before Me."
- 2 "Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain"
- 3 "Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day."
- 4 "Honor thy father and mother."
- 5 "Thou shalt not kill."
- 6 "Thou shalt not commit adultery."
- 7 "Thou shalt not steal."
- 8 "Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor."
- 9 "Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's wife."
- 10 "Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's goods."
